Free Sermon Funeral

Funeral for Cindy Hayes 2 Timothy 3:10-11

I. Intro

A. We're all here today to remember the life of Cindy Hayes.

- 1. Many people came by last night because Ms. Cindy meant so much to them.
- 2. They came.
- 3. And they spoke about their experiences with Ms. Cindy.
- 4. They remembered her.
- 5. She's part of their memory.
- 6. There are many people here today, too.
- 7. All of us here today have probably shared something from our lives where Ms. Cindy was involved.
- 8. We remember her.
- 9. We have memories of her.

B. Ms. Cindy's obituary has been in the paper.

- 1. It was read earlier.
- 2. That obituary remembers Ms. Cindy.
- 3. It's a sharing of memories.

C. Obituaries are unique pieces of writing.

- 1. It's a 2-inch wide column of words.
- 2. Its price is calculated by its length.
- 3. So, limited by those constraints...
- 4. ...We try to record the entire life of a person.
- 5. We attempt to remember.
- 6. We try to highlight our memories.
- 7. All condensed down to a couple of inches in some newspaper.

D. What can we really learn about someone from an obituary?

- 1. Where they lived.
- 2. Where they died.
- 3. A few interests.
- 4. Their survivors.
- 5. It's hard to capture all the memories we have of one person's life in a few inches of news copy.

E. It's hard to find the essence of a person in an obituary.

- 1. What made them tick?
- 2. What shaped them?
- 3. What made up their life?
- 4. How did they approach life?

F. We don't find that in an obituary.

- 1. We find that in their life.
- 2. In the life we remember.

G. That's what our memories of Ms. Cindy are made of.

- 1. They're made of seeing her live.
- 2. They're made of experiencing life with Ms. Cindy.

H. As I was recalling my own memories of Ms. Cindy, I was drawn to the life experiences she shared with a Biblical character.

- 1. I know there are comparisons between Ms. Cindy's life and the life of women in the Bible.
- 2. But I think her life was more in parallel with a prominent male Bible figure.
- 3. Paul.

I. Most Bible scholars believe the last writings we have of Paul is the book of 2 Timothy.

- 1. Paul wrote a very personal letter to Timothy.
- 2. He touched on subjects that were very important to Him.
- 3. And he wrote 2 Timothy as a man who knew his time was near.

J. There's a couple of verses Paul writes to Timothy.

- 1. Verses where Paul tries to get Timothy to remember what he's seen in the life of Paul.
- 2. These verses are 2 Timothy 3:10-11.
- 3. (Read 2 Timothy 3:10-11).
- 4. ¹⁰ You, however, know all about my teaching, my way of life, my purpose, faith, patience, love, endurance, ¹¹ persecutions, sufferings—what kinds of things happened to me in Antioch, Iconium, and Lystra, the persecutions I endured. (2 Timothy 3:10-11, NIV)

K. That was Paul's obituary.

- 1. That was his life.
- 2. An obituary couldn't capture Paul's influence on Timothy.
- 3. Paul told Timothy, "You know all about me..."
- 4. It was Paul's life, lived in living color, that made the memories.

L. We can't sum up Ms. Cindy in a few inches in the newspaper.

- 1. But our memories are made up of watching her live.
- 2. And that life she lived is a joy to celebrate.
- 3. And lessons to remember.

M. Thinking about what Paul wrote brings memories of Ms. Cindy's life.

- 1. There's so much they shared in common.
- 2. ¹⁰ You, however, know all about my teaching, my way of life, my purpose, faith, patience, love, endurance, ¹¹ persecutions, sufferings...(<u>2 Timothy</u> 3:10-11, NIV)
- 3. I saw much of Ms. Cindy's life in those words.
- 4. Memories to remember her by.

II. Ms. Cindy was an Encourager.

A. Paul wrote the entire books of 1 and 2 Timothy to encourage his spiritual son, Timothy.

- 1. As Paul gets ready to leave this world, he still wants to encourage him.
- 2. That was a mark of Paul's life.
- 3. He was an Encourager.

B. Ms. Cindy was an Encourager.

- 1. That trait came about because of how she saw people.
- 2. She saw the good in all people.
- 3. And she wanted to encourage them to be everything God created them to be.

C. My wife and I were talking about Ms. Cindy this weekend.

- 1. We were talking about the wonderful attitude Ms. Cindy always had.
- 2. How you could walk into Liberty Drugstore and she was glad to see you.
- 3. I mentioned that Ms. Cindy thought more of me than I think of me.
- 4. Because she saw things in me I can't even see.
- 5. And that's encouraging.

D. Not just a feel-good-for-a-few-minutes encouragement.

- 1. Ms. Cindy's encouragement was life-changing encouragement.
- 2. She had the ability to see the good in you.
- 3. And talk you into believing it!
- 4. That's encouragement!

E. I would venture to say that every person in this room received encouragement from Ms. Cindy.

- 1. That's what we're here to remember this afternoon.
- 2. A Godly woman who could make anybody feel they could conquer the world.
- 3. We're here to remember the contagious encouragement of Ms. Cindy Hayes.
- 4. Ms. Cindy was an encourager.

III.Ms. Cindy was an Endurer.

A. This is where I find another parallel between her and the Apostle Paul.

- 1. Paul endured many things.
- 2. Beatings.
- 3. Shipwrecks.
- 4. Snake bites.
- 5. Abandonment.
- 6. Hatred.
- 7. Yet he never lost his faith.
- 8. He never gave up on God.

B. Ms. Cindy face a lot of challenges in her life.

- 1. She had medical challenges.
- 2. Surgeries.
- 3. Heart problems.
- 4. She was challenged by quite a few health problems
- 5. Much of Ms. Cindy's later life was a challenge.

C. But she never gave up.

- 1. She never lost her faith.
- 2. She never turned her back on God.
- 3. She took the things that came at her in life and ran to God.
- 4. Hers was a faith that came from a real relationship with a real God...
- 5. ... That was with her every step of the way.
- 6. She endured.

IV.She was an Enjoyer.

A. This is what I remember most about Ms. Cindy.

- 1. There are many different single moments I remember about Ms. Cindy.
- 2. But they're all wrapped up in this one attribute.
- 3. Ms. Cindy enjoyed life in all these single moments.
- 4. She enjoyed because she loved.

B. Ms. Cindy was one of the most loving people I ever knew.

1. She loved.

C. She loved her family.

- 1. She loved her husband.
- 2. Mr. Bobby, she loved you completely.

D. She loved her children.

- 1. She was so proud of you, Robbie and Susan.
- 2. Every success you had, she shared.
- 3. Because she loved you!
- 4. She loved Dade and Emily.

E. But I have to tell you I think she loved her grandkids more, though.

- 1. Keely, Julia, Reagan, and Rob.
- 2. She loved you all.

F. She loved Monk Monk.

- 1. She loved her big sister.
- 2. She loved her nieces.

G. And here's the real proof of her ability to love.

- 1. She loved her nephews.
- 2. She loved the Moore boys.
- 3. How strong a woman does that show us?!?

H. She loved everybody she knew.

- 1. We say that about other people.
- 2. They love people.
- 3. But Ms. Cindy really loved people.
- 4. She loved persons.
- 5. Individuals.
- 6. She enjoyed people because she loved people.

V. That's Ms. Cindy's obituary to me.

A. Her life.

- 1. She encouraged.
- 2. She endured.
- 3. She enjoyed.
- 4. Her life well lived is my memory of her.

B. That's one other, very important thing I have in my memories of Ms. Cindy.

- 1. I want to go back to that passage Paul wrote to Timothy.
- 2. Read 2 Timothy 3:10-11.
- 3. ¹⁰ You, however, know all about my teaching, my way of life, my purpose, faith, patience, love, endurance, ¹¹ persecutions, sufferings—what kinds of things happened to me in Antioch, Iconium, and Lystra, the persecutions I endured. (2 Timothy 3:10-11, NIV)

C. That's what I read earlier.

- 1. 2 Timothy 3:10-11.
- 2. But there is a little more to verse 11.
- 3. Verse 11 ends like this.
- 4. 11 ...Yet the Lord rescued me from all of them. (2 Timothy 3:10-11, NIV)

D. Here's the number one memory I have of Ms. Cindy.

- 1. This defines her life.
- 2. It is the obituary she would want most to be known.

E. Ms. Cindy trusted in the Lord.

- 1. Through all the good times
- 2. And all the bad.
- 3. She trusted the Lord.
- 4. Because she knew Jesus would rescue her from it all.

F. And on January 18, 2019, He did just that.

- 1. He rescued Ms. Cindy.
- 2. All the pain.
- 3. All the hurt.
- 4. All gone.
- 5. She is with her Jesus right now.

G. Is life hard right now?

- 1. Remember life was sometimes hard for Ms. Cindy, too.
- 2. She encouraged.
- 3. She endured.
- 4. She enjoyed.

H. And she believed.

- 1. She trusted in a Savior who will save.
- 2. Save us from our pain.
- 3. Save us from our sin.
- 4. Save us to enjoy Him.
- 5. Forever.
